



A RESOLUTION RECOMMENDING ALTERNATIVE METHOD OF PROCUREMENT THROUGH AGENCY-TO-AGENCY AND RECOMMENDING FOR AWARD OF CONTRACT

BAC Resolution No. 192, s. 2018

WHEREAS, the Kalinga State University (KSU) seeks to attain economy and efficiency in all aspects of its procurement operations by resorting to the above-mentioned Alternative Method of Procurement consistent with Rule XVI of the 2016 Implementing Rules and Regulations of Republic Act No. 9184;

WHEREAS, the KSU Bids and Awards Committee was tasked to evaluate the Purchase Request No. 207-10-0794, for the procurement of [] goods or services or [] to undertake infrastructure projects or [] consultancy services from another agency of the government (i.e. Servicing Agency) subject to the provisions of R.A. 9184 and pertinent budgeting, accounting, and auditing rules and regulations;

WHEREAS, Agency-to-Agency Agreements shall be governed by [] Consolidated Guidelines for the Alternative Methods of Procurement, or by [] special law for procurement of printing services from Recognized Government Printers, and [] Procurement of Common-use Supplies and Equipment from DBM-PS;

WHEREAS, said item/s is/are included and conformed to the approved budget of the end-user's Project Procurement Management Plan (PPMP), and KSU Annual Procurement Plan (APP) for CY 2018;

WHEREAS, procurement from another agency of the government is more economical, subject to the following conditions:

- 1. That entering into an Agency-to-Agency Agreement with the Servicing Agency is more efficient and economical to the government;
- 2. That Servicing Agency has the mandate to deliver the goods and services required to be procured or to undertake the infrastructure project or consultancy required by the Procuring Entity;
- 3. That Servicing Agency has the absorptive capacity to undertake the project;
- 4. That Servicing Agency owns or has access to the necessary tools and equipment required for the project;
- 5. Sub-contracting is not allowed, however, the Servicing Agency may implement the infrastructure project in-house, by job-order, or through the pakyaw contracting system; and
- 6. For procurement of infrastructure projects, the Servicing Agency must have a track record of having completed or supervised a project, by administration or by contract, similar to and with a cost of at least fifty percent (50%) of the project at hand.

WHEREAS, the objectives and purpose of the contract do not constitute an unnecessary, excessive, extravagant, or unconscionable expenditure, and that the HOPE through the BAC has determined whether KSU is entering into a contract with technically, legally and financially capable supplier(s), contractor(s) or consultant(s) by requiring the submission of relevant documents or through other means prior to recommendation of award to the HOPE.

NOW THEREFORE, we the Members of the BAC, hereby **RESOLVE AS IT HEREBY RESOLVED**:

to recommend Alternative Method of Procurement through an Agency-to-Agency Agreement as provided in Sec. 53.5 and its guidelines of the Revised IRR of R.A. 9184 for the above-cited [] goods/services, [] civil works, or [] consulting services; and

to recommend the award and approval by the KSU President of this Resolution and Purchase Order/Notice to Proceed to the successful bidder/s indicated in the Abstract of RFQ/Canvass.

RESOLVED FINALLY, to post this Resolution at the PhilGEPS and KSU Websites, and other conspicuous place at the premises of the University including the BAC Bulletin Board.
